IKE INTERIOR DESIGNERS, WE EDITORS ARE BARRAGED BY TREND NEWS.

Every day we receive hundreds of messages touting the latest, greatest, and not-to-be-missed cutting edge products, innovations, ideas and studies. Using our collective experience, we decipher which ones are important, relevant, statistically sound and worth our time and attention. Trends that are impactful—not just interesting—are quickly parsed from the pack. Three that made the cut are population-centric: The growth, graying and diversification of Valley residents are topics we're keeping our eye on.

Population growth in Maricopa county is well substantiated and its effects are likewise evident. Housing starts, home values and remodeling numbers continue to go grow upward. Older neighborhoods are seeing renewal, with existing homes being upgraded or demolished and replaced by new ones. Multi-family dwellings—often with vertical, multi-storied floor plans—are popping up both in established and recently developed areas. High-rise apartments—a good number with equally lofty price tags—are changing the look of Phoenix and Scottsdale while attracting a variety of demographics.

The graying of America's population is also happening in the Southwest. Baby boomers are moving into their late 50s to early 70s; the oldest millennials are nearing 40. As these two influential groups age, they want different things. Boomers are looking for smaller residences that offer turn-key living; millennials are drawn to options with lots of amenities and community life. The trend of single millennials leading home buying for their age group that's happening in other parts of the country may also take root here.

Diversification within the Valley's population is inherently tied to people from other parts of the state, country and world moving here. As major companies see Phoenix as a

good place to base their work force, as Americans migrate from northern locations to southern ones and as other cities are less attractive due to escalating cost-of-living, we will benefit from transplants adopting the desert. Here at the magazine, we editors see homes created with specific needs and tastes that are culturally based and expect this design diversification to continue.

As with all trends, there are exceptions. While these three population topics aren't iron-clad, they are pervasive. Like a slow-moving storm that first appears, then rumbles with anticipation, then finally lets loose overhead, these population trends are happening and it's best for all of us to acknowledge and embrace them. Our editorial direction and plans reflect this understanding—we feature a diverse, inclusive and always changing mix of home and garden design. Additionally, we work to help solve some of the challenges these trends bring. From our issue that focused on the future of the Southwest home to innovations in high-tech construction to highlighting today's brightest leaders in residential design, we take a positive, forward-looking approach to our subjects.

We count on interior designers to be our partners on this important journey. Your insights to clients' needs, marketplace advancements and regional adaptation are invaluable to us and to our readers. Whether we meet and talk at one of your projects, at an industry function or over a catch-up coffee, your professional viewpoint is always welcomed and appreciated. 





DESIGNER OF DISTINCTION Award
